INTRODUCTION

The most significant change in the academic year 2021- 2022 was unarguably brought about by the retirement of former Principal of the college, Dr. Thomson Joseph and Vice Principal, Rev. Dr. Manuel Pichalakattu, necessitating a change in leadership which subsequently led to the induction of Dr. Bijimol Thomas, thus creating history, as the first ever woman to hold the office of Principal in the history of Newman College. Dr. Saju Abraham, Head of department of Botany, was appointed as Vice Principal and Rev. Fr. Benson N Antony, Assistant Professor, Department of English, as bursar in the place of Rev. Fr. Paul Karakombil was transferred to St. Joseph's Church, Peringuzha.

The COVID-19 crisis that has engulfed the world in recent years posed several challenges to higher education in India. The academic year 2021-2022 witnessed the second and third waves of the pandemic and the ensued hindrances. Undeterred by the unprecedented need to draft strategies to cope with the uncertainties due to the ever-evolving pandemic and associated public health restrictions, Newman College rose to the challenge and found new and innovative ways to continue to provide outstanding quality education to our student community. I am extremely proud of the achievements of our college over the past year and want to recognize the hard work of the entire faculty and staff, who adapted their routines, methods and modes of working to support our students and institution. The year was one of unexpected change and resilience and we harnessed our collective energy and optimism to continue to deliver high quality education and experience.

Following Covid-19 guidelines, we provided seamless digital learning experience enriched by online webinars, symposiums, virtual seminars, monthly lecture series and discussion forums till lockdown restrictions were lifted. College reopened in February and returned to its normal functioning in full swing with reinvigorated alacrity. The blended learning had no bearing on the outstanding academic merit and our college upheld the standards and quality of education throughout these hard times as evidenced by the great results it had produced in terms of academics and sports.

We successfully conducted two internal examinations for both UG and PG students without any complaint and other academic activities were also done safely. The academic performances of the year 2021- 2022 remained unscathed amidst the recrudescence of pandemic induced encumbrance and have produced meritorious results. Bismi Nizar of Department of English secured second rank in MA English exam and students from various departments secured top ranks in MG University Undergraduate and

Post Graduate examinations. We were able to conduct Onam/Christmas celebrations and our prestigious programme, merit day in the stipulated time.

Our college is one among the 15 colleges all over India that has been selected for DBT-STAR College Scheme under the “Strengthening Component” by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science & Technology with a financial support of INR 63 Lakhs to invigorate teaching and to provide unique exposure to experimental science. We finished the construction of the extended administration wing equipped with manager’s cabin, guest room, dining hall and parlor under the scheme of RUSA. We completed renovation and maintenance work on various sections and departments of the college. A video room, open gymnasium, state of the art research scholars’ room, renovated and amply equipped chemistry lab and computer lab and skillfully designed exam hall are some of the recent infrastructural accomplishments made by our college with regards to enhancing the amenities provided by the college. We also successfully implemented STRIDE project sanctioned by UGC with regular intensive orientation and training programmes. The innovative and entrepreneurial initiatives undertaken by the Institution Innovation Council of Newman College earned a two-star rating by Ministry of Education. Newman College was selected for a workshop on “Popularization of Plant Taxonomy: a workshop based itinerary to document flora of the campus” with a financial support of INR 75000 by Directorate of Environment and Climate Change (DOECC). To facilitate academic progress and interaction, several international and national conferences, webinars and symposia with active participation from students and esteemed scholars were conducted under UGC Paramarsh Program, thereby, marking our strong presence in the academia of the state. The Harita Campus mission and Pachathuruttu, major green initiatives undertaken received Harita Campus award.

Many of the faculty members of our college served as resource persons in many webinars in last year and received appreciation and accolades. Dr. Alex Joseph was awarded with the prestigious SERB International research Fellowship and Chief Minister’s Navakerala Post-Doctoral Fellowship, Divya James of Commerce Department was awarded with Ph.D. and Dr. Bijimol Thomas has been recognized as a research guide by MG University and Lt. Prageesh C Mathew, received the title of Captain after successful training.

Building on the legacy of achievement, this has proven to be another exceptional year for Newman College. We have lived up to the pledge to build more bridges with the institution, students and the community, to be more innovative and entrepreneurial, to support performance, excellence and leadership of dedicated and talented faculty and students and to ensure that graduates receive a quality and impactful learning experience, enabling them to do meaningful work and have meaningful lives.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

RUSA GRANT UTILIZATION

The College has received infrastructure grants to Government Aided Colleges of Rs. 2 Cr. under the Rashtriya Uchcharat Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA).

Rev. Dr. Pious Malekandathil, and Higher Education Secretary Rev. Fr. Paul Nedumpurath, on 23 March 2022. All members of faculty and students joined in the event.

RENOVATION OF SCIENCE LABS

Renovation of science laboratories of B. Sc. Chemistry, B. Sc Zoology, B. Sc Physics and B.Sc. Biotechnology were done with RUSA grant. Granite laying of the Science Block, Stair cases and tiling of some class rooms and administrative block were also completed.

ENERGY MANAGEMENT CELL, GOVT. OF KERALA GRANT- COMPLETED

Being the winner participant in the Reboot Kerala Hackathon 2020 in the theme energy, the team from Newman College, Thodupuzha under the mentorship of Dr. Alex Joseph, Asst. Professor, Department of Chemistry got direct entry to the Small Grants Programme of Energy Management Cell, Govt. of Kerala without screening steps and received financial support for prototype development.

OPEN GYMNASIUM

In order to promote outdoor excersises an open Gymnasium was inaugurated by our beloved Manager Rev.Fr. Msgr. Pious Malekkandathil on 15 March 2022. Students are able to train themself freely and permitted to use all the equipments available during their leisure time.

RESEARCH SCHOLAR'S ROOM

A Research Scholars room was inaugurated by our beloved Manager Rev.Fr. Msgr. Pious Malekkandathil on 15 March 2022, to provide study space for Research Scholars. It offers a controlled environment and better retention to al Researcher's.

SCHEME FOR TRANS-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH FOR INDIA'S DEVELOPING ECONOMY (STRIDE) PROJECT - ON GOINING

One of the highlighted achievements of this year is that the college is selected to UGC'S newly introduced and prestigious "Scheme for Trans-disciplinary Research for India's Developing Economy (STRIDE)" Project. The project envisages the research capacity building of the institution over a period of three years. The main objectives of the stride project are to identify young talents - students and teachers, strengthen research, build capacity, promote innovation, support trans- disciplinary research relevant to national development. STRIDE supports and promotes research projects that are socially relevant, locally need based, nationally important and globally significant to accomplish Sustainable Developments Goals. Maximum financial assistance under this scheme is 1 core. Dr. Jenni K. Alex, Department of Economics is the co-ordinator of the project.

PARAMARSH - UGC SCHEME FOR MENTORING INSTITUTIONS - COMPLETED

As a part of the quality mandate, University Grants Commission (UGC) has developed the scheme of PARAMARSH, a new initiative for mentoring non-accredited institutions to enable them to get accredited by 2022. The scheme intends to promote well performing accredited institutions to Mentor the NAAC accreditation aspiring Mentee institutions to upgrade their academic performance and get accredited.

Newman College was identified as a mentor institution owing to the College's performance in NAAC with a Grade of 'A' with CGPA 3.32 in the third cycle. STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMME

LEARNING SUPPORT MECHANISMS

The students now have better opportunities to acquire new skills and training. The state government sponsored schemes like Additional Skills Acquisition Programme (ASAP), Walk With the Scholar (WWS) and Scholar Support Programme (SSP) are of great help to the students in nurturing their talents.

ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

Additional Skill Acquisition programme is new initiative under Higher Secondary Education which aimed to inculcate job skills to students of higher secondary and college going students. In our college ASAP programme was started in 2014.

ASAP skill Development Course is a free programme offered by the government for those students who are come under BPL, OBC and other backward classes. A trainer is appointed by ASAP exclusively for this programme.

REMEDIAL COACHING / MENTORING- PROGRAMME

The college is providing remedial coaching to the weak students in all departments. Each student is getting the assistance guidance and support of their mentor.

ADD-ON COURSES/CERTIFICATE COURSES/VALUE ADDED COURSES RUNNING

Career oriented add-on programmes/Certificate Courses/Value Added Courses are currently running in the college. Each department is taking good care in conducting all these programmes.

CENTRE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

As part of the skill development programme, the Centre of Continuing Education, Kerala conducts diploma courses on Professional Diploma in Shipping and Logistics (1 Year) and Advanced Diploma in Logistics and Supply Chain Management (6 Months).

PLACEMENT CELL

Placement cell offers job opportunities to students. The cell also offering different courses such as Bank coaching, TALLY course etc. to enhance the potential of students. These are very useful for

students to achieve great heights in their career. Many students from our college are actively participating in job fairs & recruitment drives. Renowned firms like HCL, Goan International institute, Infosys, Wipro, TCS have recruited our students. They are offering high salaries.

INDIRA GANDHI NATIONAL OPEN UNIVERSITY (IGNOU) STUDY CENTRE

The IGNOU study centre, functioning in the college, offers a number of Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree and PG Programmes. Regular students can join these courses to enhance their job potentials and skills. The courses offered are:

- M.A. in English, Rural Development
- Bachelor Programme in Commerce, Tourism, Social Work, English, History, Sociology etc.
- Diploma/ Certificate programmes in Computer Education, Tourism, Rural Development, Food and Nutrition, Human Rights etc.

M.G. UNIVERSITY STUDY CENTRE

The M.G. University Study Centre in the college campus offers a rich variety of latest books in almost all subjects. The Electronic Library called INFLIBNET containing several online journals is freely accessible at this centre.

LEARNING RESOURCES

Sufficient Learning Resources are an inevitable part of the educational requirements. In this regard, the college is blessed with a well functioning library under the leadership of Ms. Liz Jacob, the Librarian. The UGC sponsored Network Resource Centre and the INFLIBNET e-shodh sindhu facility is available in the library through which the students can access learning resources through internet. Our Library has a total collection of 53046 books and around 103 magazines and Journals.

ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT

The college has a well-defined structure with the governing body at the helm of affairs. The Patron and the Manager are the guiding forces in the running of the institution. The various academic and non-academic activities are planned and co-ordinated under the overall supervision of the Principal. The Principal is advised and assisted by the College Council. The non-teaching staff works under the direct supervision of the Principal to discharge the varied services to the teachers, the students and the general public. Different committees of staff members facilitate a collective working environment in the

college. Besides, certain academic and administrative powers are delegated to all the department heads. Periodic meetings of the Principal with HODs are convened to take stock of the overall situation.

COLLEGE COUNCIL AND GENERAL STAFF MEETINGS

The College Council is the highest advisory body as far as the internal administration of the college is concerned. As many as 10 meetings of the council were held during the year. There were many occasions which required the council to advice and support the Principal for the smooth running of the institution. The council discharged its duties in full conformity with such requirements. Dr. Jenni K. Alex, Department of Economics functioned as the Secretary to the Council. Apart from the College Council, general staff meetings were also a great source of help for the administration. The Patron, Mar George Madathikandathil, Rt. Rev. Msgr. Dr. Pius Malekkandathil, College Manger, Rev. Fr. Paul Nedumpurathu, Secretary to the Corporate Educational Agency addressed the staff many times. Frequent staff meetings of teaching and non teaching staff, open discussions have always helped improving the atmosphere on the campus.

INTERNAL ACADEMIC AUDITING

The IQAC and college management prepared and distributed an Academic Performance Appraisal format to all regular teachers and evaluated their performances. The performance appraisal of teachers by the management committee and students are conducting every academic year. Such an exercise becomes very essential as the quality of education largely depends on the performance of teachers. The Corporate Educational Agency distributed a self-appraisal format to each teacher. The management committee evaluated each such form and suggested corrective measures, if needed.

On the other hand, students are also made to evaluate their teachers online. Each teacher is evaluated by the students on a 10 point scale on the basis of 10 indicators. The students are also made to offer suggestions so as to improve the performance of the teacher. The score sheet is given to each teacher. These two initiatives have proved to be very fruitful in improving the teaching-learning environment in the college.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

The financial management of the institution is done under the direct supervisions of the principal. As a govt. aided institution, the salary part of the regular staff is borne by the govt. For the purpose of developing physical infrastructure, the college is receiving grants from UGC. Its utilisations are monitored by various committees like Planning Board, Building Committee and Purchase Committee.

EXAMINATION WING

The most important component of an academic exercise is the conduct of examinations. Fortunately, the college traditionally has a well knit organisational mechanism to supervise and conduct the University and the internal examinations. All examinations in the college are conducted under the direct supervision and control of Dr. Saju Abraham, Department of Botany, the Chief Superintendent of examinations and Sri. Xavier Kurian P., Department of Economics, the Assistant. The internal assessment component is being looked after by Dr. Krishnakumar V., Department of History. Internal examinations were held twice for each semester and papers valued and distributed to the students.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Newman College was established on 30 June 2004 and it has become an integral part of the institution's system and work towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. Over the years, the IQAC has developed a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of the college, evolved mechanisms and procedures for ensuring that the objectives of the IQAC as envisaged by NAAC are met and has made a significant and meaningful contribution towards channelizing efforts and measures towards academic excellence.

The IQAC of the College coordinates all quality-related activities by developing an organized methodology of documentation and internal communication. It works to enhance and integrate the various activities of the College and to ensure the adoption and dissemination of good practices. The IQAC spearheads the conduct of the internal and external Academic Audit of the departments, which promotes quality, accountability and transparency. Such Academic Audits foster healthy competition among departments and sharing of good practices. The IQAC coordinates all the activities of the college. An effective feedback system has been developed to facilitate the feedback process to monitor the quality and efficacy of the policies and processes of the institution. PARENTS TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The general PTA online meeting during the academic year 2021-2022 was held on June 10, 2021. The meeting discussed matters regarding the conduct of online classes in the wake of Covid situation.

The first PTA executive meeting during the academic year was held on June 17, 2021. It was an online meeting on Google meet platform, due to Covid lock down situation. The meeting congratulated the students who secured University ranks in the Degree and PG examinations. It also acknowledged the role of teachers in preparing the students for the university examinations. FUTURE PLANS

The College, having reaccredited with 'A' grade by the NAAC in the third cycle, is all set to enter the next cycle of accreditation with necessary augmentation in the physical and academic facilities to cater the global needs of higher education and for to attain a remarkable position in excellence and status of the College. Our future plans for the next academic year include:

PREPARATION OF SSR FOR NAAC ACCREDITATION AND ASSESSMENT

The College will give prime importance to review the new Self Study Report (SSR) format and facilitate the preparation of the same. All data collection on quality initiatives in the last five years will be done.

ICT ENABLED TEACHING LEARNING FACILITIES

All classrooms are expected to upgrade to ICT enabled smart classrooms with wifi interface and facilities for blended classroom modes. For this, we hope to add ICT tools in all classrooms. Complete shift of e- learning process to LMS provided by the new Management Information System (MIS) Linways. Linways will be used as a learning management system too.

SHIFTING THE ADMISSION AND ADMISTRATIVE PROCESS TO NEW MIS

Linways will be used for complete automation of admission and evaluation process. Linways administrative, teacher and student interfaces will help in submission and retrieval of data effectively.

SYSTEMATIC MAPPING OF OUTCOMES (OBE IMPLEMENTATION)

The OBE module of Linways will be used effectively to map the course and programme outcomes and to create question banks based on Bloom's taxonomy for continuous internal assessment component in OBE mapping. The evaluation process will be systematically done through the new interface more effectively.

RENOVATION OF THE BOTANICAL GARDEN

As the construction works of RUSA supported physical structures resulted in the complete demolishing of the botanical garden, it will be relocated and placed in a more appropriate area (behind the present E block and canteen area, facing the main entrance).

NEW LABORATORY SPACE FOR SCIENCE SUBJECTS

Lab spaces will be identified and allocated for the newly approved course- Psychology and for other science subjects to promote the research ambience of the College.

COLLEGE WEBSITE RENOVATION

The College website will be renovated to make it more user friendly and appealing. The website general template will be modified to a student centric manner and to give a better perspective of the College

COMPLETION OF THE NEW ENTRANCE FOR THE COLLEGE

The completion of works for the modification of the existing College gateway is in the priority list of physical infrastructure augmentation. Expansion of vehicle runway and pedestrian's path is expected to complete soon. As the Govt. of Kerala have issued an order No. 26433/G1/15/H.Edn. dt. 12-10-2015 which clearly stipulates designated parking area for students' vehicles, the parking area is proposed to be developed at the right side of the proposed gate.

INSTALLATION OF THE STATUE OF CARDINAL NEWMAN

Another important plan for this year is the reinstallation of the statue of our Heavenly patron, John Henry Cardinal Newman who was canonized last year. We consider this as a signature initiative as it is an honour for our college which is named after Newman. We plan to place a complete statue of Newman right at the front gate which would definitely change the face and appearance of our college.

RENOVATION OF COLLEGE AUDITORIUM, KALAM PARK, LANDSCAPING AND GARDENING OF THE CAMPUS

We have decided to make necessary alterations to the college auditorium to make it sound proof. We also intend to expand the stage and furnish it properly to facilitate the staging of various programmes. The Kalam Park is a well appreciated student centric space in the Campus which is in need of renovation. Along with that the areas encircling the new RUSA funded building and the main buildings need proper landscaping and gardening. We plan to renovate Kalam Park and beautify the campus with landscaping and gardening.

PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE / INSTRUMENTATION

A new central block is to be constructed in order to meet the demands of autonomy and ensure adequate physical infrastructure. This bridges the gap between the Arts and Science blocks, thereby redressing a long-standing grievance. We plan to build Ramps and renovate classrooms. All

departments are to be checked to ensure that there was adequate software and computational facilities to meet the needs of a growing institution. Necessary equipment is to be bought and installed.

ADMINISTRATIVE PLANS

Organize inter and intra institutional workshops/seminars on various quality related themes and scientific themes. Facilitate the career advancement of faculty members. Organize activities and events that will promote skill-enhancement for teaching and nonteaching staff. Facilitate building career paths and enhancing competencies of students. Collect and compile feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholders. Undertake Infrastructure Audit Administrative and Academic Audit Complete and upload SSR.
